- IV. Investing in Children
  - A. CSF Funding Opportunities

1. Core Funding Calendar Year 2024

Following extensive review by the External Affairs Committee, Dir. Morgan indicated that the committee was recommending the board approve the proposed calendar year 2024 funding slate, as presented in the board packet. This slate represents 72 organizations and 86 projects for a total of \$15,658,730.

The External Affairs Committee made a motion to approve Calendar Year Funding for \$15,658,730.

2. Core Funding 2023 - 25% Cash Match Release

In response to an anticipated CSF surplus for 2023 and in light of several recent changes by other local funders, the External Affairs Committee recommended a release of the cash match obligation for currently funded programs, with \$2,760,961 for the 2023 calendar year contracts and \$1,374,179 for the 2023-2024 academic year contracts.

The External Affairs Committee made a motion to approve a one-time release of the cash match by the CSF totaling \$4,135,140.

3. Capacity Building: One Time Technology Funding Opportunity CSF staff recommend that the board approve a one-time technology funding opportunity with an application window from November 1, 2023, through December 8, 2023. The award would carry a project cap of \$35k, based on submission of receipts for expense reimbursement.

4. Collaboration Opportunity: Child Abuse Roundtable Mr. Whitten brought forward a request for the board to approve a special funding request of \$85k to provide one year of support in 2024 for the Child Abuse Roundtable. This award would support a part-time coordinator, administrative and social media support, rebranding of the roundtable, website updates, and special events hosted by the roundtable.

In response to questions, it was explained that CSF has provided \$10k in funding to this group for each of the past three years. Due to the loss of funds from other local funders, the roundtable relies on dues from member non-profits, with the majority of the cost for this work taken on by The Children's Place. This award would also be based on a request for reimbursement basis by the Roundtable upon submission of receipts. A motion was made to award \$85,000 to the Kansas City Child Abuse Roundtable for 2024, based on receipts submitted for reimbursement. First: Ann Mesle Second: Judy Morgan Motion: Approved

## **Collaboration Applications**

There are currently four applications in the queue ready to present to the External Affairs Committee for review. If fully funded this would total \$7.9M over three years.

- 5. Core Funding: Academic Year 2024/2025 and 2025/2026 Update Letters of Intent (LOIs) for Academic year funding opened on October 2, 2023, and will close October 27. The Greater Kansas City Community Foundation will compile the LOIs for CSF review by November 3, 2023. Invitations to apply will be extended on December 4, 2023. It is anticipated that a slate will be presented to the Board for approval at the April 2024 meeting.
